## **City of Pleasant Hill Seeks Input to Name New City Park**

**Pleasant Hill, Iowa** – The City of Pleasant Hill is seeking public input to name the new 77-acre City park located southwest of Four Mile Elementary School. The City purchased the land in November 2014. Suggestions for the park’s name may be submitted through Tuesday, Feb. 28.

“We would like community members to be involved in the process to name what will be our newest and largest City park,” said Mayor Sara Kurovski. “This will be a signature park in our community offering open spaces, wooded areas, and gathering spots for area residents to enjoy passive and active recreational uses in a setting unmatched in the metropolitan area.”

Residents are encouraged to submit their suggested name for the new park at various community events, City Hall or on the City’s website – [pleasanthilliowa.org/parkname](http://pleasanthilliowa.org/parkname). When submitting a suggestion, participants must also provide their name, address, email, phone number and a brief explanation of their suggestion. Amenities at the new park could include: soccer fields, dog park, splash pad, shelters, open green space, picnic areas, community building, nature trails, and restroom facilities.

At the end of the submission period, the park project team will consider the list of suggested names and narrow it down to as many as three to present to the Pleasant Hill City Council for final approval. The individual who submits the winning name will be recognized at a City Council meeting.
